

Innovative home nearly ready for a happy haus warming –

SEEING is believing – a luxury two-storey home has been assembled in just two days on a prime Currumbin beachfront site.

The quirky home is now just days away from being moved into by proud owner, Brisbane identity Peter Lewis.

The architect-designed home by Brisbane company Happy Haus arrived on Tuesday with seven pre-fabricated sections lashed to six semi-trailers.

Within hours, the base of the building had been lifted into place by a 40-tonne crane and the final pieces were ready to go when rain forced the construction to be delayed overnight.

Clear skies allowed to project to be finished yesterday and over the next two days electricity and sewerage will be connected.

The \$700,000 house comes complete with most amenities including a laundry, luxury fittings and fixtures and an art studio.

Happy Haus founder Toby Lewis said the only thing needed now was furniture and the owner's personal touch.

Peter Lewis, the former Queensland Rugby League chairman, said he planned to move in either tomorrow or Monday.

He said he was looking forward to his Gold Coast sea change and becoming part of Currumbin.

"It's a great place and I hope that my new home has added the uniqueness of the place," he said.

Mr Lewis said he planned to settle in with his family for a beachy Christmas but would consider opening it up in the new year as a temporary display home.
